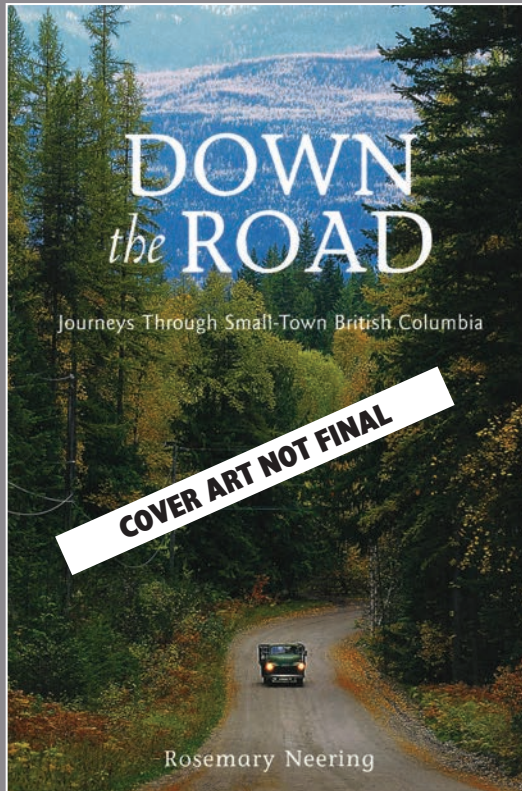

A few of the places portrayed are Merritt, Campbell River, Vanderhoof, Nelson, Kaslo, Nakusp, Prince George, and Quesnel.

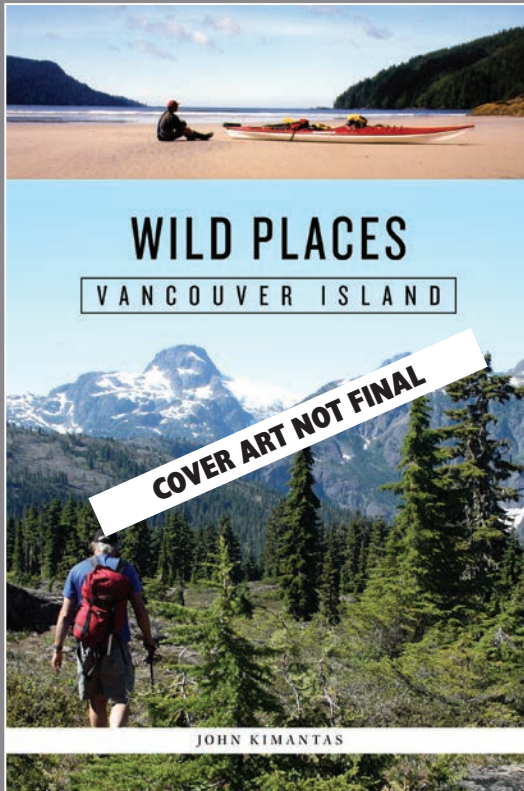

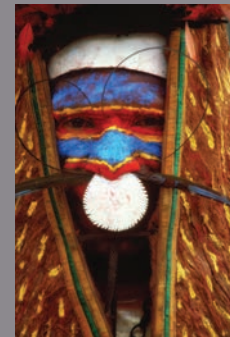
# AMAZE

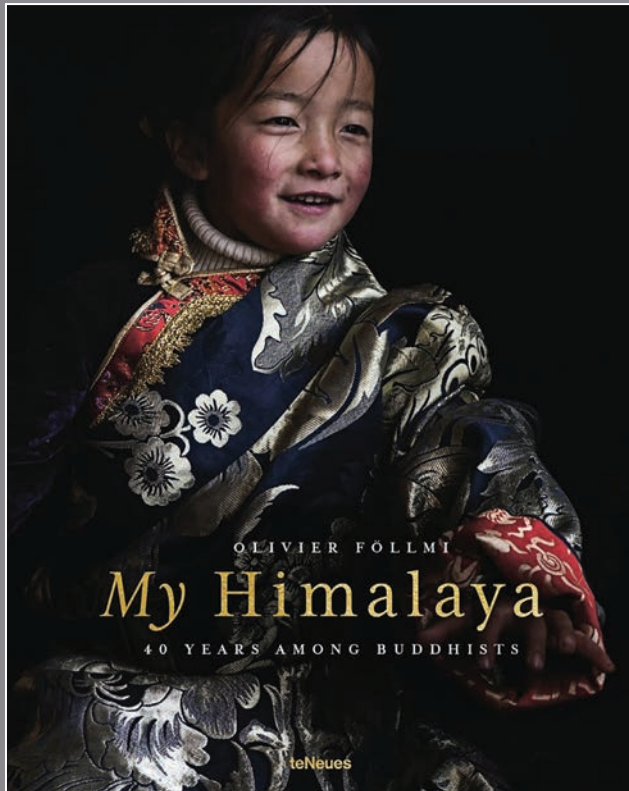

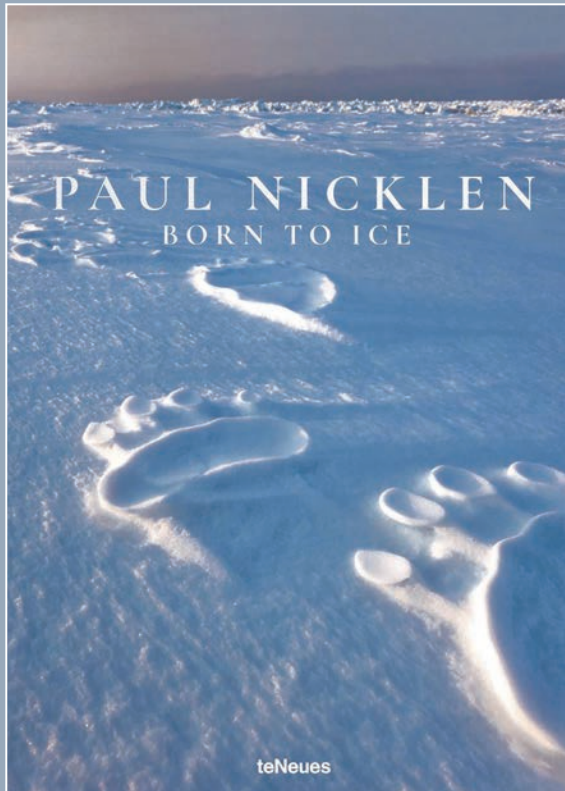

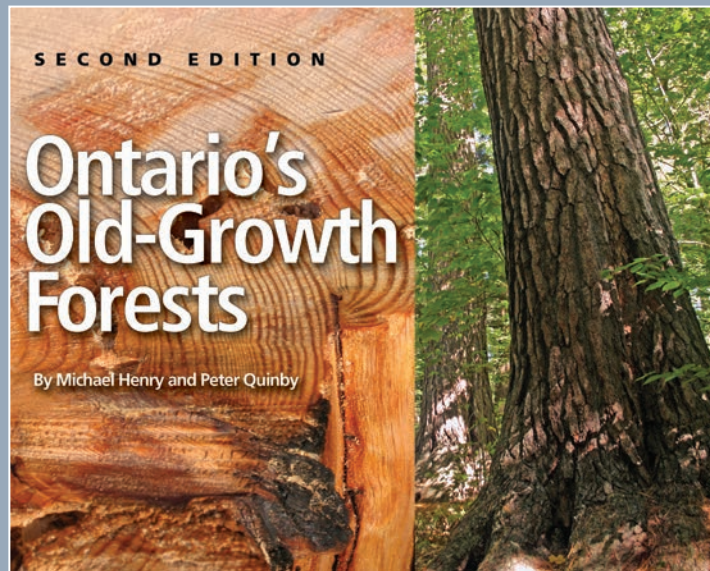

## ONTARIO'S OLD GROWTH FORESTS

by Michael Henry & Peter Quinby



This is a complete revision of the book originally published in 2010, with the help of the Ancient Forest Exploration and Research Centre. It is a guidebook, complete with history, ecology and maps, accompanied by essays written by noted experts in the field. Copiously illustrated with maps and photographs, the text explores all 59 of Ontario's forest regions: deciduous (Carolinian), great lakes - St. Lawrence and boreal...in addition to the ancient cedars - the dwarfed cliff-growing trees on the Niagara region which can reach over 1300 years in age.

The revised edition has updated sites and information, new sites added, an expanded section on Quetico Provincial Park, and new essays. Also included is a more comprehensive chapter on forest conservation, which offers solutions to the many, many threats to the forests of today.

Michael Henry is an associate ecologist and webmaster with Ancient Forest Exploration and Research. He also writes about sustainable building and broader issues of sustainability at [thesustainablehome.net](http://thesustainablehome.net).

Dairy goes vegan! The recipes in this book are all temptingly good. They are clear and simple and each process has simple step-by-step instructions.

The introduction features information about essential ingredients (and not just soya), kitchen utensils and the various fermentation starters that are available, how to make these at home, what other ingredients are helpful and above all where to get them.

There are basic recipes, such as cashew cheese, on which other recipes then build and a whole range of vegan 'milk classics' to make. Vegan cheese, yogurt, tofu, milk, cream and butter are surprisingly diverse and easy to prepare. The wealth of recipes spans the spectrum from tomato rosemary cheese made from almonds, fermented by Rejuvelac and herbal cream cheese from coconut cream, almond crème fraîche to chickpea tofu. There is even a recipe for cheese dip for nachos, and mac and cheese.

In addition to the cheeses there are several recipes for spreads, butters with different flavours and full-bodied delicacies such as ricotta or mascarpone. And there are faster variants such as the 'pizza cheese'.

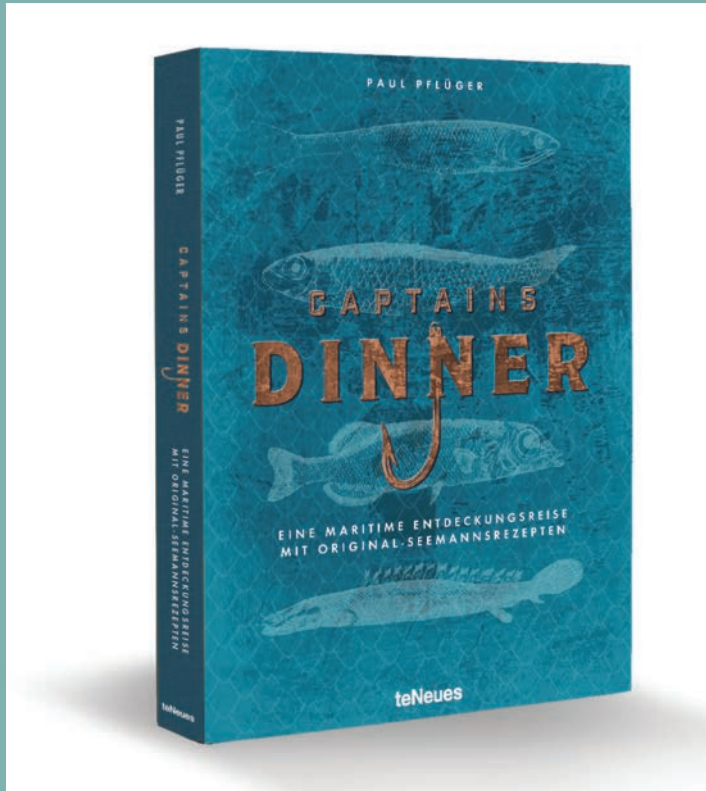

Piloting the Bristol F.2b with 22 Squadron, John Everard Gurdon's first victory was on 2 April, 1918, and by 13 August he had bagged his twenty-eighth. Between those dates, he flew with gusto and elan, often with Canadian colleagues such as Alfred Atkey, the fifth highest scoring Canadian ace of the war.

Although a native of Newfoundland, she had spent much of her working life in what was then the Northwest Territories, now Nunavut. This is the powerful recasting of the history behind Jordan's Principle.

Jordan River Anderson, a First Nation's child from Norway Cree House Nation in Manitoba. Born with complex medical needs which could not be treated on-reserve, he spent more than two years in a Winnipeg hospital, before doctors would allow him to go home. But he never made it, jurisdictional disputes between the federal and provincial government over who would pay for Jordan's care, kept him the hospital for another two years.

He died in 2005, never having spent a day in a family home.

Jordan's Principle was established in response to this tragedy. It calls on the government agency of first contact with a First Nations child in need of medical care to ensure that that child receives access to public services on the same terms as other children. The Canadian House of Commons passed Jordan's Principle unanimously in December 2007, but government intervention has been limited and slow.

When Spirit Bear's mom tells him about an important human rights case happening in Ottawa, he makes the LONG trip by train (his favourite way to travel) to go and watch and to stand up for First Nations kids. And he is not the only one! Lots of children come too—to listen, and to show they care. Spirit Bear knows that children can change the world because he is there to see it happen.

Cindy Blackstock is a member of the Gitskan First Nation. She has been working for First Nations children for over 25 years, first as a child welfare worker, and now as the executive director of the First Nations Child & Family Caring Society. Eddie Robinson (Anishinaabe/Muskegowuk Cree) was born in Toronto.

Amanda Strong (Spotted Fawn Productions) is a Michif filmmaker, media artist, and stop motion artists currently based out of the unceded Coast Salish territory also known as Vancouver.
